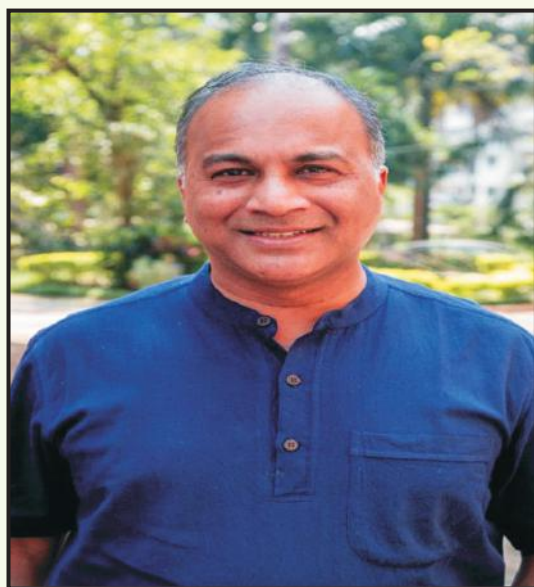

## PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

One of Mahatma Gandhi's famous quotes is, "Strength does not come from winning. Your struggles develop your Strengths. When you go through hardships and decide not to surrender, that is Strength". In March of the year 2020, we were faced with an unprecedented situation. A lockdown was declared without any advance warning. This caused panic and an exodus of poor migrant workers to their villages. It led to untold misery, suffering and death. People however are resilient and have tried to evolve their own strategies and use inner potential to adapt to the new "Normal situation." The present pandemic had an impact on everything that we were so accustomed to, including our education system. The classes at schools, colleges and universities in the state have been closed since March 16th, 2020 for more than one year not only due to the fear of infection, but also as a precaution against the spread of this terrible disease. It has already claimed so many lives. Online education began in earnest during this time.

Youth is a phase of life which is marked by vitality, vigor and an urge to achieve something remarkable. During this time, young people take on new roles and responsibilities and become more reliant on their peers and less on their parents. College days are often described as the most desirable time in the life of an individual. This enjoyable stage has however experienced a setback, due to the pandemic caused by COVID-19. College students form, maintain, even modify their relationships through activities which are primarily scheduled keeping the structure and functions of academic Institutions in mind. Lockdown removed these opportunities.

The last one year taught us to think and work differently from the conventional trends that we were used to. 'What's App' has been followed by creation of Google Classrooms for the students. We teachers have got accustomed to various digital platforms, where we interact with each other defeating the physical distance. Viva – voce of Ph.D scholars has also been held through virtual meeting. During this lockdown period came the new device, a technological marvel – the 'Webinar'. What a miracle it is! This online



technology brought many academicians of diverse subjects across the continent together.

COVID-19 changed our teaching – learning mode wholly. When the teacher was teaching the students physically in the classroom, the teacher could see through the eyes of the student, how much his/her education is reaching the student, whether something needs to be explained again. The experience that makes a student's eyes light up after understanding a subject that satisfies the teacher, is something I am missing with these online classes. One of the great tests taken in this system is of the teacher as question – paper – setter and examiner. In this age of open book examinations, it is necessary to frame questions in such a way, so that the examinee have to apply their knowledge, even in the case of multiple choice questions (MCQs).

COVID – 19 has taught us a lot of things. We have learned the basics of health and hygiene from our experiences during the last year. The lesson learned is that the key to health care is not just cure, but prevention. Corona also gave this exhilarating realization that hundreds of people are concerned about our well being – not just our relations, but our students, friends and even people whom we do not know personally. Many people are working together to organise food, medicine, oxygen and other essentials for COVID patients thus developing social solidarity between the communities.

There has been a change in the attitude of the elders towards the young learners. For a long time, elders have objected to the use of the mobile phones by the young learners. “Eyes will get worse” they said. Now we are witnessing really the opposite! We see the elders telling the pupils to concentrate on online classes.

The unprecedented time of COVID – 19 has created significant changes to the landscape of teaching – learning, forcing us to redefine our interactions and engagement with the students. I congratulate the Teachers and Students for contributing and sharing their heartfelt experience during this COVID – 19 pandemic. There is a changing scenario of the post – pandemic education system in the field of higher education. The New Normal Education, we are heading towards will certainly not become all – encompassing online, but it is probably not possible to completely eliminate online education! Just as computers and information technology have become a part of our lives, online education has also come to stay in the field of education. The need of the hour is an optimized blending of digitization and the human touch. We all are trying our best to adjust to the new form of teaching – learning mode. It is an opportunity to re invent ourselves. We have now prepared our self to face the New Normal and once again we will be back to our Classrooms. Waiting to see you in the Corridors of the Class.

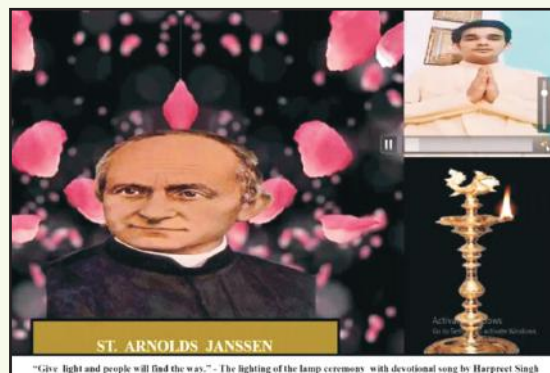




# SHOW US YOUR TALENT

A Panel Discussion was organised on **Convention on Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination against Women( CEDAW )** jointly with Swami Vivekanand Night College of Arts and Commerce, Dombivali (East) (Affiliated to University of Mumbai) and B.M. Ruia Girls' College, Gamdevi (West) (Affiliated to SNDT Women's University) on 14<sup>th</sup> April 2021.

CEDAW defines the constitution about the Discrimination against women and sets up an agenda for National action to end such discrimination. CEDAW has been adopted by the UN in 1979. India have also signed CEDAW in July 1980 and ratified it in 1993 with certain reservations.

CEDAW is very important for **YOUTH** today because they are the eyes and ears for monitoring whether women and girls rights are being protected. They are able to suggest government, how it can advance with respect to women rights in line with the convention.

The programme commenced with Welcome and Introduction by Prof. Sunita Sharma, Incharge Principal, St. Arnold's Night Degree College. This was followed by Dr. Santosh Kaul Kak, Principal, B.M. 

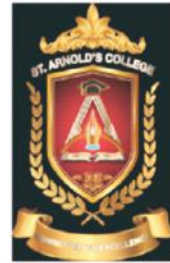

#### Stay Indoors

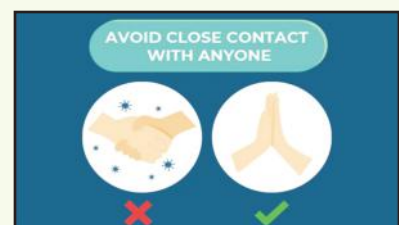
Avoid participating in large gatherings places. Make sure you wear full sleeves shirts with anti-pollution masks when you travel. Staying Indoors is a rather safe option.

## Different Calamities of 2020

### 2020 'The Worst Year'

You've heard it, haven't you? Maybe you also have said it. I have been hearing this on news, social media and this has always been a topic of discussion all throughout 2020. Most of that was because of the complete lockdown that we are experiencing since March '2020.

Most of us will remember the year 2020 due to the Covid-19 pandemic which hit not only India but the whole of the world including animals as well. But the year 2020 has kept everyone on the edge with a new calamity hitting with every passing month right from the pandemic to the Floods, from Earthquakes to the Bush Fire and from Locust attacks to Human crisis. We have seen or heard everything and If I have to write about all the calamities, I am sure this piece of paper will not be enough to mention everything but let us look at some of the natural calamities that rocked and shocked us through 2020.

### 1. **Cyclone Amphan in India and Bangladesh**

Cyclone 'Amphan' is now among the strongest, deadliest and costliest storms recorded in the Bay of Bengal. As many as 128 lives were lost across the region due to this havoc. This storm costed around \$15 billion and is amount to top 20 storms costing above a billion.

### 2. **Locust Attack**

The year 2020 witnessed the Locust attack across the northern India which continued to the west as well. This outbreak was registered in Maharashtra, Gujarat, Rajasthan, Madhya Pradesh, Punjab, Haryana and Uttar Pradesh. The locust entered from Pakistan and Iran with the first swarm spotted in Jan'2020. The Locus originated form East Africa and affected as many as 23 countries on their way.



### 3. **The Australian Bush Fire and the Uttarakhand Forest Fire**

The Australian bush fire burned an estimated 18.6 million hectares, destroyed over 5,900 buildings, and killed at least 34 people, while over 400 people were killed due to the residual smoke inhalation.

In Uttarakhand forest fires started in late May, after several forest fires broke out in Srinagar of Pauri Garhwal district. As of 24<sup>th</sup> May 2020, 46 fires were reported covering around 71 hectares and 2 people have died.

### 4. **Floods in Kerala, Indonesia and United Kingdom**

Kerala has recorded highest rainfall leading to flood at Calicut Airport runway. Further to add to its severity due to bad visibility, the Air India Express flight 1344 crashed of which reported 18 deaths.

These are just some of the most dangerous calamities that costed money, home, land and most importantly life. There are lot more calamities that caused distress to humans over the entire year, but this also gave time to humans and governments to think and bring a change that we need to do in our way of living and our way we treat other humans, our environment as well as our mother earth.

We are thankful that 2020 has gone by but we need to be more careful in 2021, we may look at what the governments are doing but what we need at this moment is to change our self and start caring more and more for the nature so that we can at least reduce the natural calamities and further build a better and safer planet.

Teaching in Covid times was a challenging task for the Teachers.

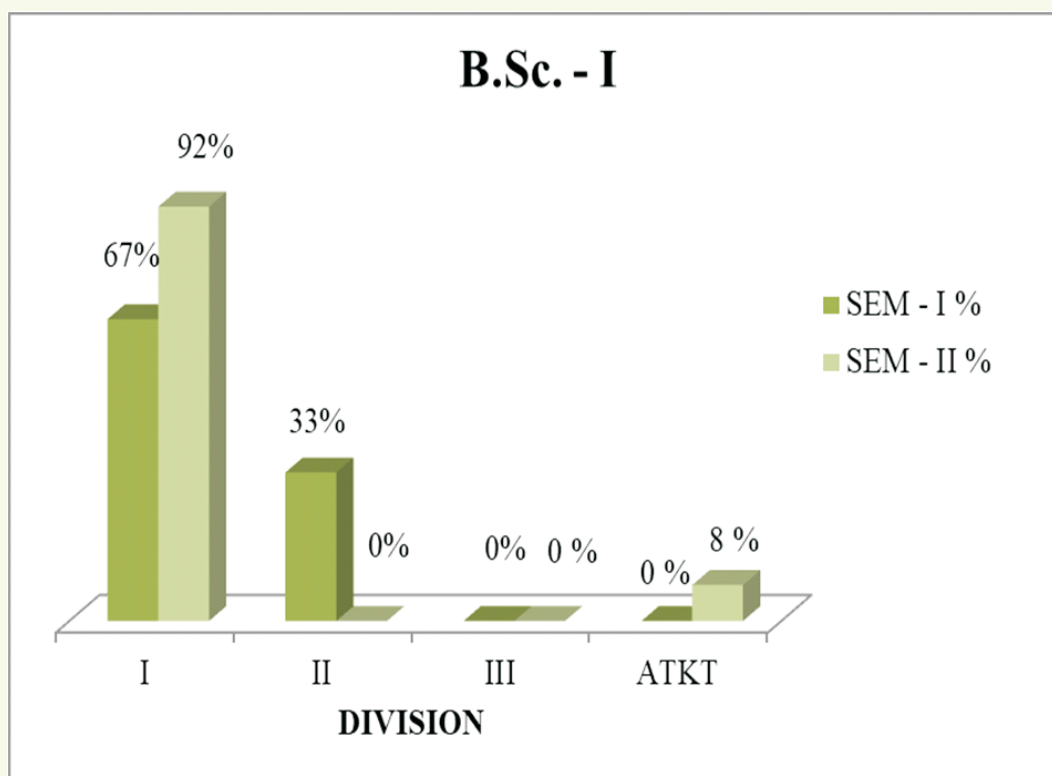
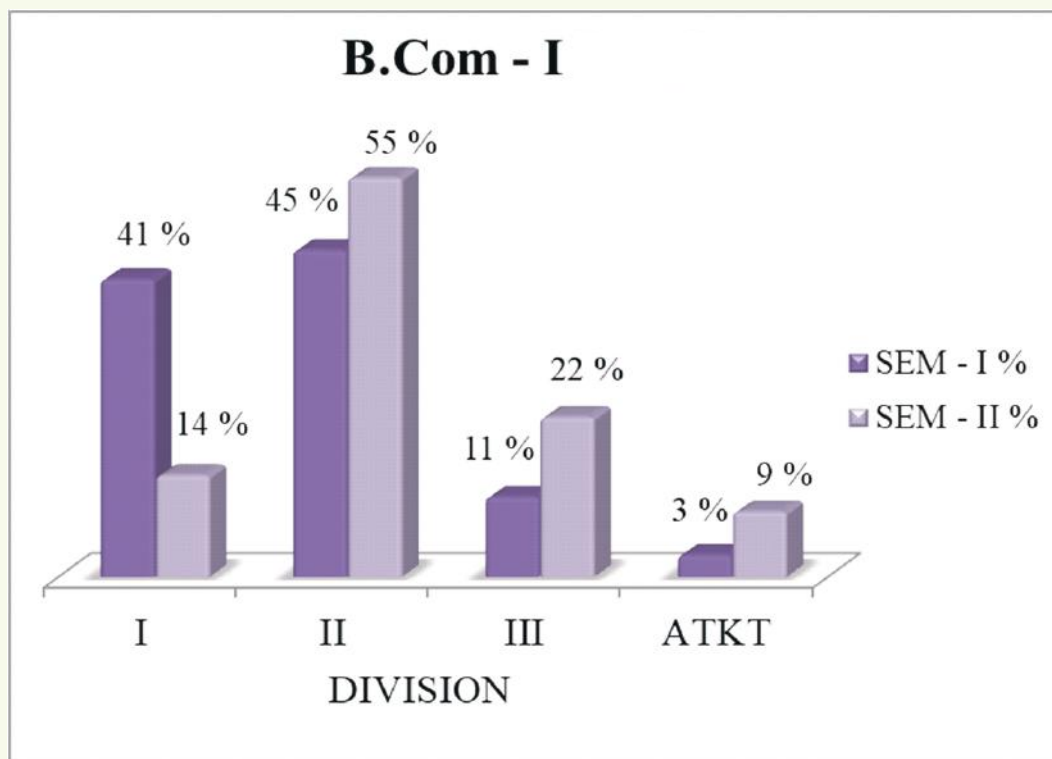

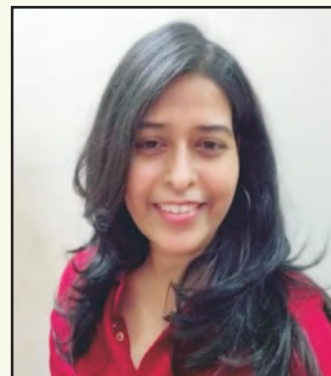

**Convention on Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination against Women (CEDAW), adopted in 1979 by the UN General Assembly is an international bill of rights for Women consisting of a preamble and 30 articles. It defines what constitutes Discrimination against women and sets up an agenda for national action to end such discrimination. India signed CEDAW in July 1980 and ratified it in 1993 with certain reservations.**

**CEDAW is very important for Youth today because they are the eyes and ears for monitoring whether women and girls rights are being protected. They are able to suggest government, how it can advance with respect to women rights in line with the convention. These colleges of Mumbai - St. Arnold's Night Degree College of Arts and Commerce, Donmbivali (East) (affiliated to University of Mumbai), Swami Vivekananda Night College of Arts and Commerce, Donmbivali (East) (affiliated to University of Mumbai) and B.M. Rusa Girls' College, Gamdevi (West) (affiliated to SNDT Women's University) came together and organised a Panel Discussion on Online mode.**
