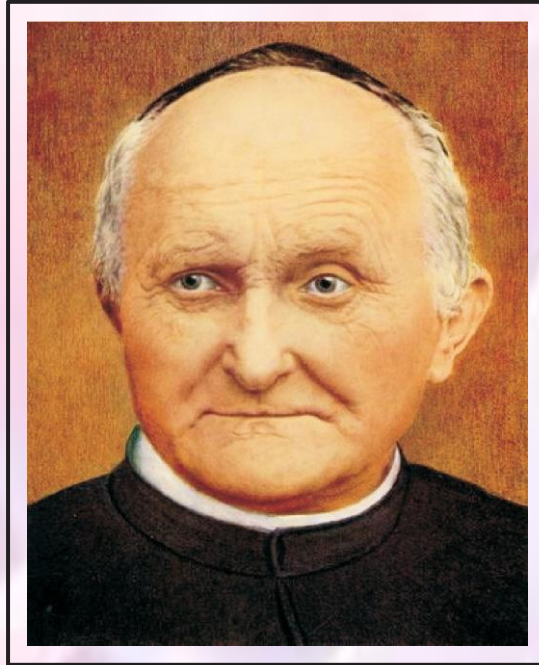

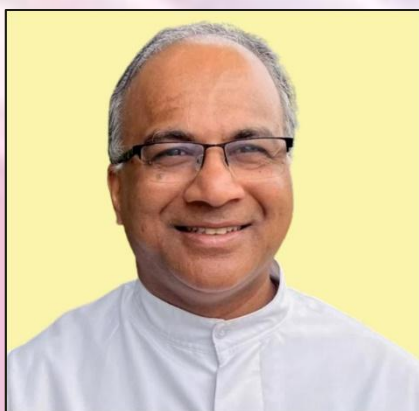

NEW EDUCATION POLICY

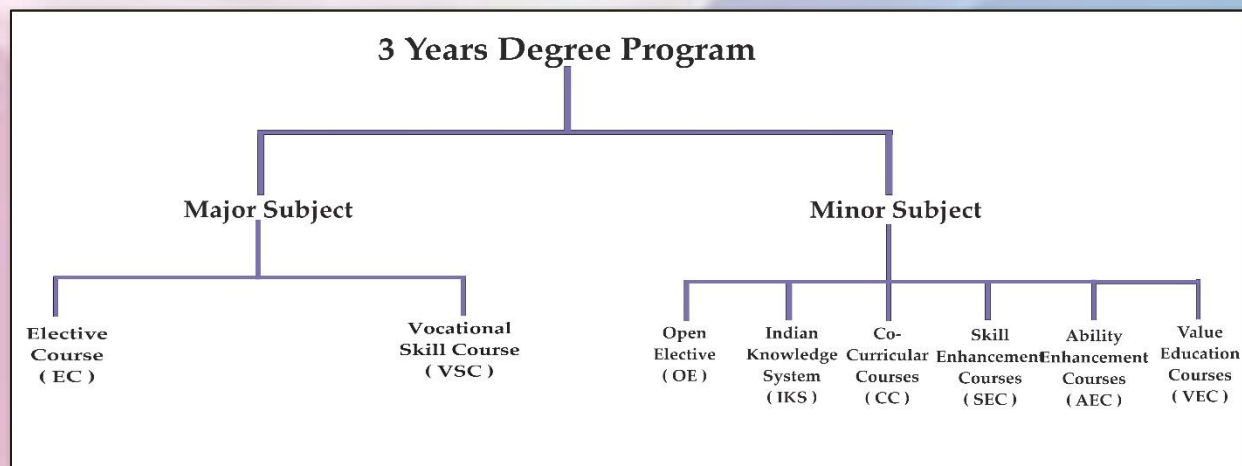

ADMISSION GUIDELINES & COLLEGE REGULATIONS

Eligibility for Admission:

Students seeking admission to the three-year undergraduate degree programs in B.Com., B.Com. (MS), B.Com. (A&F) and B.Sc. (IT) must fulfil the following criteria:

- Must have successfully passed the Higher Secondary Certificate (HSC - Std. XII) Examination conducted by the Maharashtra State Board of Secondary & Higher Secondary Education or any other recognized board.
- Students who have passed an equivalent examination from another state board or recognized university must submit the necessary documentation for verification.
- For **Self-Financing Courses**, students must have secured a **minimum of 45% marks** in the qualifying examination.
- For **B.Sc. (IT)**, it is **compulsory to have Mathematics** as one of the subjects in HSC or its equivalent.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

1. Applicants must first complete the **Pre-Registration Form** on the **University of Mumbai** website and select **St. Arnolds Night Degree College (College Code: 1207)**. A **printed or digital copy** of this form should be kept for reference.
2. After completing the pre-registration, candidates must fill out the **College Admission Form** available on our website: arnoldscollegeandheri.edu.in.

3. While filling the online admission form, students should have **scanned copies** of the following essential documents ready for upload:

- Recent **passport-size photograph** (80 × 107 pixels / 10KB)
- **Signature scan** (80 × 35 pixels / 10KB)
- **University Pre-Enrolment Form**
- **HSC Mark sheet & Leaving Certificate**
- **SSC Passing Certificate**
- Any additional certificates (e.g. disability certificate for specially-abled students)

4. Additional documents required at the time of submission:

- **Aadhaar Card (Photocopy)**
- **ABC ID / APAAR ID**
- **Valid Caste Certificate** (for reserved category applicants)
- **Gap Certificate** (if there is a gap of one year between HSC and Degree admission.)

5. **For students from other state boards or universities**, the following documents must be submitted:

- **Original & photocopies of HSC mark sheets and certificates**
- **Transfer/Leaving Certificate (Original & two copies)**
- **Migration Certificate** (If the respective board does not issue this, an official letter from the board must be provided)
- Copy of verified Mark sheet from the board.

Important Notes:

- **All admissions are provisional** until officially approved by the **University of Mumbai**. Candidates must ensure they provide a **valid email ID and mobile number** for university notifications.
- We provide **scholarships** for the student scoring **more than 90%**.

DISCIPLINARY RULES & REGULATIONS

At St. Arnolds Night Degree College, we expect students to uphold the highest standards of **discipline, respect, and responsibility**. The following regulations are in place to ensure a **safe, structured, and conducive** learning environment:

General Conduct

1. **Identity Cards:** Students must wear their **college ID card** at all times on campus.
2. **Ragging Prohibited:** The college maintains a **zero-tolerance policy** towards ragging. Any student found guilty of engaging in ragging will face **strict disciplinary action**.
3. **Attendance & Class Conduct:** Loitering in the corridors or campus during lectures is not permitted. Students must **attend classes regularly** and maintain decorum.

Campus Discipline

4. **Prohibition of Substance Use:** Consumption of **alcohol, smoking, or any intoxicants** within the college premises is strictly prohibited. Entering the college under the influence of alcohol or drugs is also not allowed.
5. **Unauthorized Collections:** No student may collect funds for **picnics, trips, study material, or other activities** without the **explicit approval of the Principal**.
6. **Respect for College Property:** Students must handle college infrastructure **with care**. **Damaging furniture, AC units, or misusing resources** will lead to strict penalties.

Personal Responsibility & Safety

7. **Securing Belongings:** The college is **not responsible** for the loss of **books, valuables, or personal belongings** left unattended in classrooms or on campus.

8. **Notice Board Updates:** It is the student's responsibility to regularly check the College Notice Board and Website for important updates and announcements.
9. **Restricted Use of Mobile Phones:** The use of **mobile phones or handheld devices** is **strictly prohibited on campus**. Any violation will result in the **confiscation of the device**.

Examinations & Academic Integrity

10. **Unfair Means During Exams:** Any student caught using **unfair practices during examinations** will face **severe disciplinary action**, including **possible expulsion** as per the **University of Mumbai's regulations**.

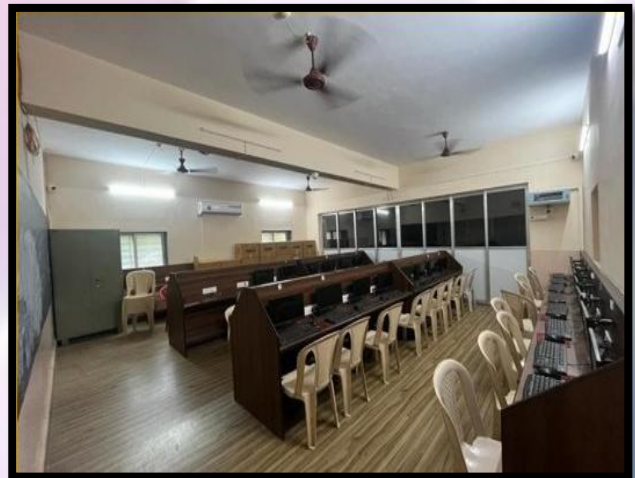

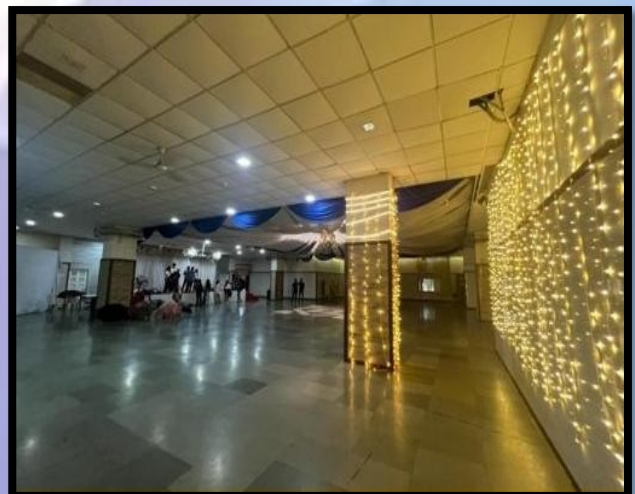

RESEARCH CELL
